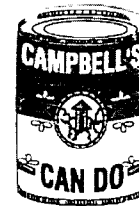

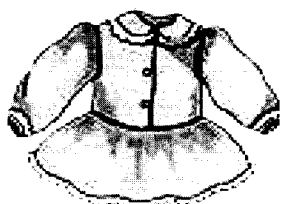

## **MARCH IS COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH**

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, colorectal cancer is the third most common cancer for men after prostate and lung cancer and if detected early enough, colon cancer can be successfully treated. Male or female, if you are over 50, take time to get screened. Early detection can save lives. So get your rear in gear.

## **MARCH 22<sup>ND</sup> IS AMERICAN DIABETES ALERT DAY**

This day is set aside by the American Diabetes Association to raise public awareness of the signs, dangers, and treatment of diabetes. Diabetes is a disease in which the body does not properly use or does not produce insulin. Insulin is the hormone that breaks down sugar, starches, and other food into useable energy for the body's cells. The cause of diabetes is unknown, but genetics, obesity, and lack of exercise appear to play roles in this disease. There are two major types of diabetes; Type I and Type II. Type I occurs because the body isn't producing insulin, the hormone that "wakes" the cells up and tells them to let glucose come. Approximately 5-10% of the

Americans who are diagnosed with diabetes have Type I. Type II occurs when the body fails to properly use insulin, this is referred to as insulin resistance and is combined with insulin deficiency. It is estimated that 90-95% of Americans diagnosed with diabetes have type II. Diabetes often goes undiagnosed because of its seemingly harmless symptoms. Recent studies suggest that early diagnosis and treatment of diabetes can reduce the chance of developing complications from the disease. Symptoms of diabetes include, but are not limited to excessive hunger, excessive thirst, frequent urination, unusual weight loss, increased fatigue, irritability, and blurry vision.
